

COVID-19 Bulletin

This bulletin relates to the Local Government Areas (LGAs) and case locations published by NSW Health associated with the COVID-19 outbreak in NSW and associated directives from Dr Kerry Chant, Chief Health Officer NSW Health for residential aged care facilities.

All staff, visitors and contractors must declare if they live within or have visited any listed LGA or if they or anyone they live with has visited any of the listed Case locations in the timeframe indicated.

PLEASE CHECK THE LOCATIONS LISTED VERY CAREFULLY PRIOR TO ENTERING THE VILLAGE.

1. Chief Health Officer of NSW directives for relevant LGAs /areas of interest

Areas with increased testing

There are currently no local government area (LGA) or suburbs identified as areas with increased testing.

If you live in or have visited the local government areas (LGAs) or suburbs listed above in the past two weeks, get tested and self-isolate until you get the result, even if you have mild COVID-19 symptoms such as a runny nose or scratchy throat

All Staff and Visitors

ALL staff and visitors who have been:

- in a location of interest in New Zealand in the last 14 days
- on or after 7 November 2020 have been in a contact tracing location in South Australia – see page 3 for suburbs

Must NOT ENTER the village until further notice.

Visitors

ALL visitors who in the last 14 days have:

- worked, lived in, or visited areas with increased testing

Must wear masks while in the facility and be escorted by facility staff when going to and from a resident's room (or designated visiting area).

Staff

ALL staff who in the last 14 days have:

- worked, lived in, or visited areas with increased testing

Must wear surgical masks when in the facility, including when caring for residents and where physical distancing (1.5m) from other people cannot be maintained.

This includes DURING BREAKS where physical distancing cannot be maintained.

2. Chief Health Officer of NSW directives for COVID-19 Case locations

Ongoing: any staff and visitors who have visited any of the **COVID-19 Case locations** at the same time as a COVID-19 case (see lists on page 2-3 of this bulletin) are **not permitted to enter the village** for 14 days since their visit to the listed location.

NSW COVID-19 Case Locations

Self-isolate and get tested immediately if you've been to these locations or public transport routes

If you have been to these locations or public transport routes during the time and date indicated you should:

- immediately [self-isolate](#) until 14 days after you were last there
- [get tested](#) even if you have no symptoms
- watch for [COVID-19 symptoms](#) and get retested should any symptoms recur
- even if you get a negative test, you must [stay in isolation for 14 days](#) as it can take 14 days before you may show symptoms or test positive.

NSW Health is asking people who travelled on the below services at the following periods to get tested immediately and self-isolate, until further advised by NSW Health.

Monitor for symptoms if you've been to these locations

If you have been to any of these locations during the time and date indicated you should:

- watch for [COVID-19 symptoms](#)
- if symptoms occur, immediately [get tested](#) and [self-isolate](#).

No locations associated with a confirmed COVID-19 case within the past 14 days.

Interstate and New Zealand locations

South Australia and New Zealand have recently identified case locations.

If you have recently returned from Adelaide and have been to any of the sites of concern listed on [SA Health](#), whether listed as [people who must quarantine](#) or [monitor your symptoms](#), please get tested immediately, regardless of symptoms.

People who must quarantine must isolate for a full 14 days from the time they were at the venue, regardless of the whether the test result is positive or negative.

People who visited the [monitor your symptoms](#) locations should isolate until a negative result has been received, and get tested and isolate again should any symptoms develop.

Keep informed if you have travelled to these locations and are required to [self-isolate](#), or to monitor for [symptoms](#).
